

Migration at the Museum of Nature and Science Pub Talk

On May 24, 2014, researchers from Carleton University's Fish Ecology and Conservation Physiology Lab put on an interactive event to raise awareness of the importance of migratory species and open rivers. They were able to interact with over 250 participants with games such as "spawning run plinko", which taught kids the challenges of fish migration (including fisheries capture, predation, pollution, dams, etc.), fish face painting, and "migrate" your migratory fish postcard. Additionally, participants were able to engage with researchers and understand more about the issues and how scientific research can help. The event finished with a Pub Talk in the evening.
